## **Taskforce Committee Reports**

The Executive Committee updates were provided by Lisa Pakkebier, the chair of the committee. The Committee met on June 10 and discussed the in-person meeting for the next OCTF meeting. The Olmstead Plan was also discussed, more in the Olmstead Plan Committee report.

The Nominations Committee updates were shared by Lisa Pakkebier, a member of the committee. The Committee has not met since the last full Taskforce meeting as there are no current openings on the Taskforce, therefore no need to review applications.

The Olmstead Plan Committee updates were provided by Amy Desenberg-Wines, the chair of the committee. The Committee met on May 28 and discussed how the state uses the Olmstead Plan and ways to streamline the usage of the Olmstead Plan.

The Community Access Committee updates were provided by Jen Simmering, the chair of the committee. The Committee has been working toward accessible parking throughout Iowa (for those who use wheelchairs and especially those who drive themselves). Dave Ruffcorn

presented on accessible parking and suggested a book on Access for Everyone by Dr. Arvid Osterberg ([https://www.fpm.iastate.edu/accessforeveryone/pdf/afe\\_2010\\_third\\_edition.pdf](https://www.fpm.iastate.edu/accessforeveryone/pdf/afe_2010_third_edition.pdf)), Jen was in contact with this author and he provided resources and offered to join a meeting. This Committee is working to make a flyer out of the information from the professor. The Committee has also worked on improving railroad crossings by starting at a crossing in Iowa City where wheelchairs were getting stuck. Construction is now underway to make the crossing more accessible.

The Medicaid & Legislative Watch Committee updates were provided by Paula Connolly, the chair of the committee. Since this is Paula's last term, there is a call for a Taskforce member to chair the Medicaid & Legislative Watch Committee. The planning for a virtual and a separate in-person hill day for next year will begin in August. At the next committee meeting members will have a discussion about the legislative priorities and potential partnerships (e.g., Iowa DD Council) for the Taskforce. There was also a call for members to be willing to share their stories at these events.

### **Public Comment**

Anne Crotty, Health and Human Services, shared there was a request for the chat from the meeting be saved as there were many great resources shared.

Eugenia Kendall, Health and Human Services, shared the findings from the focus groups from this meeting will be reported out with those in attendance.

Lisa Pakkebier shared Joel Vander Molen will chair the September Olmstead Consumer Taskforce meeting.

Bill Loyd shared if the Olmstead Consumer Taskforce chooses to do another hybrid option, the University of Iowa would be a great host potential.
