#### **Proposed Focus AREAS for OCTF**

### A. Medicaid

- Overhaul at state level; reauthorization at federal level
- Track reforms (past and future) and have a presence at public comment meetings

## B. Availability of Supports

- Capacity
  - o Waiting lists and inadequate number of providers to meet the need
  - o Inadequate reimbursement rates for providers
  - Direct Support Professional Workforce Crisis (see ANCOR REPORT)

# C. Employment

- Support the Work Without Worry Act
- D. Strategies once the full committee decides on areas of focus, the subcommittee will work to
  - Track actual legislative bills
  - Develop personal stories of how the bill affects people (one page leave behind documents)
  - Develop specific asks and educate legislators on the implications of proposed legislation
